"The top of the Pocono could lie as in the Pollach No. 2 at approximately 80 feet below the 1740 depth recorded as Little Lime. Pay would come at 1815 to 1820 with water 1820 to 1824."

"Production was always limited due to water which could not be shut off. Packer would not reach the water which was just below gas. Both gas and water presumably in the Keener Sand. This record is peculiar in that the Keener Sand is at the Big Lime horizon which is not exactly true to form and usual occurrence."
