Dr. I. C. White gives the following interesting account of this gas well in Vol. I, page 358, of State Survey reports:

The Kyle peel of Tyler is on the waters of Indian Creek, near the 'Big Moses' gas well, one of the largest gas flows ever struck. The flames from this well when burning through 82-inch ensing to a height of 173 feet, according to accurate measurements made by Mr. C. S. Lyon, the civil engineer of Sistersville. Mr. Browne of the Philadelphia Gas Company estimated its output at more than fifty million cubic feet daily, and this was the objective point of the great 16-inch gas line of that company which was extended from the Pennsylvania gas fields across Greene, Wetzel, and Tyler Counties, a distance of 60 miles. But before the connection could be made with the 'Big Moses' well on the Moses Spencer farm, 2 miles above the mouth of Indian Creek, the Kyle oil pool had been spened near by in the same sand ('Big Injun') and the glery of the 'Big Moses' had departed, not thorugh one well but through scores of them."

This well has long ego been abandoned." (N-N-T-Spt.-1909).
